

With the personal connection via Meal Train, there really is no comparison Door dash vs slow cooker-. And you don't have to worry about the driver snagging French fries

Our current setup has 4 teams. Each team has a leader. I activate the team leader who deploys the group to help the household in need.

Rotating teams this way allows more people to minister to those in need of food – or just comfort. Maybe someone would just like a visit and a few tasty cookies-

We need people to prepare meals- which do not have to be extravagant, fancy homemade feasts. We also welcome a designated driver or 2 to deliver food that one of our volunteers prepares.

If you fear the kitchen, there are still ways to help.

- * Westborn has excellent prepared meals that you could pick up and deliver
- * a simple package of precut cheeses and healthy crackers can round out a simple soup
- * Offer to deliver a meal that someone else has prepared
- * Whip up a big batch of your family favorite and freeze half to be ready for the next person in need
- * Use your skills to create something healthy on the fly when someone is in need.
