


# Meal Packing Event November 9, 2024

# Who is Israel and Why Should I Care?

Christians know that our faith grew out of the faith of ancient Israel. We are less sure about what we should make of the Old Testament, and even less sure how we should regard Israel. Is Israel the chosen nation? Does our faith require or encourage us to be loyal to modern Israel? Is the modern nation of Israel a continuation of ancient Israel, and do all the covenant promises still apply? Christians have had lots of different views on these questions. We begin our class discussing some of these views, and then we take a deeper dive into the historical realities of ancient Israel as we find them in the traditions of the Old Testament. We will conclude by asking a more direct theological question: what does Israel have to do with faith in Jesus? There has been a change in the class schedule. It will run for six consecutive Sundays beginning October 6 and ending November 10. We will gather for each session in Mitchell Hall following worship. **Schedule:**

October 27 The Prophets and Exile
