Continues Today, March 9, 2025 at 11:30a.m.

First Presbyterian Church has committed to being a Matthew 25 congregation. That means that we have affirmed a series of three emphases suggested by our denomination for ministry in the present context (congregational vitality and addressing systemic poverty and structural racism). But, what is Matthew 25—I mean, the twenty-fifth chapter of Matthew's Gospel—really about? The sayings of Jesus collected in this chapter go far beyond a church revitalization and mission program. Jesus talks about divine judgment, the end of the age, and what it means to "know" the Christ who will come as "king." For four weeks, Pastor Tom will gather in Mitchell Hall (following worship) with whoever is interested in digging deeply into the text of the Gospel and grappling with questions of divine justice and mercy, eternal destiny, and Christian hope.
